

**-Otsego County Department of Health offers free new mobile app to residents-**

This new app is designed to help Otsego County citizens stay tuned to up to date information regarding important health issues, as well as services and programs of the health department. After downloading the app onto your smartphone, you can receive up-to-the-minute alerts from the health department. One of the app’s key features is a calendar of upcoming clinics and events, as well as information on the weekly free health clinic for persons without health insurance. Under the Main Menu, you can access articles on communicable diseases, community health issues, and emergency preparedness. There is also a link to Spanish language health information.

Of high-level importance is the Opioid Resources feature. This will lead you to call the Mobile Crisis Team, read about mental health and addiction, and understand how to navigate addiction services. And a map pinpoints locations of treatment facilities.

“Previously I struggled with getting information out to reach people: website, paid advertising, Facebook,” said Heidi Bond, director of the Otsego County Department of Health. “I decided to develop an app because I feel that this is the way of the future to connect with people. Things are changing so fast, and we now have a way to easily update our information and get it into the hands of our community.”
