## End-of-Year Library Activities!


Library classes come to a close this month, and students will be reviewing what they have learned in library this year.

They were graded according to a rubric and when all research challenge scores were tallied at the end of the unit, the winning tribe was presented with their million dollar check just like on the TV show...
