## 2nd Graders Complete Mammals Research Projects!

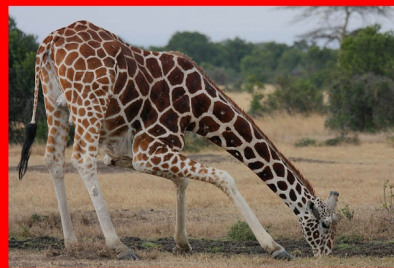

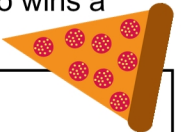
