

Kindergarten & Grade 1 Library Classes are 'Meeting' Authors!

Each month Kindergarten & Grade 1 library classes are being introduced to a different Author of the Month, learning about their lives and reading their books. In September we met Christian Robinson, an award-winning author & illustrator whose books highlight characters of color. In October we read Halloween-favorite The Bones of Fred McFee and The Pumpkin Fair (accompanied by homemade pumpkin cookies!) by Eve Bunting, and November's Author of the Month is Asian-American Grace Lin, who grew-up an hour from Oneonta and is now both a Caldecott & Newbery-Award winning author and illustrator whose books celebrate her Asian-American culture and heritage.



5th Grade Studies Media Literacy!

This Fall, 5th grade library classes have been learning about Media Literacy, which they should be able to describe as "One's ability to understand what they see, read & hear in the media," with a particular focus on

the Internet. We have discussed fake news, fact vs. opinion, copyright & fair use, fake photos & videos, and more. Parents: ask them what they've learned and why it is so important!
