





Hundreds of New Books Await Eager Readers!

Kindergarten students can have one book at a time, due back at each library class, whicle students in grades 1-5 can have two books per visit and due back at each library class. Please help your child to keep their books in a safe place, and take the time to read together for a few minutes each day!
